

Allen Township Trustees

September 7, 2010

The Allen Township Trustees met in regular session at 7:00 p.m. in the Allen Township Center with all members in attendance.

The minutes of August 3, 2010 were read and approved as read.

The Fiscal Officer presented a list of warrants (3614 – 3641) totaling \$ 16,284.78 for outstanding bills. Recker moved to pay these bills with Huffman seconding. Roll call - all yes.

The Trustees presented and discussed their respective monthly road inspections. The documented observations were reviewed with action plans being developed where appropriate and noted on the inspection forms.

The Fiscal Officer presented a Resolution Accepting the 2011 Amounts and Rates as Determined By the Budget Commission and Authorizing the Necessary Tax Levies and Certifying them to the County Auditor. Recker moved for the adoption of the resolution with Huffman seconding the motion. Roll call - all yes.

Current inside millage for Allen Township is .9 mill General Fund, 2.3 mills Road & Bridge Fund, and .9 mill Special Levy Fire Operations/Equipment Fund.

The Fiscal Officer presented a Resolution Adopting Countywide Mutual Aid Agreement For Hancock County Firefighters Association. Flanagan moved for the adoption of the resolution with Huffman seconding the motion. Roll call - all yes.

The Fiscal Officer presented the Abstract Driver Records for all Allen Township individuals authorized to operate township vehicles to the Trustees and Fire Chief for their review.

Flanagan advised that he filed a formal complaint on behalf of Allen Township with the Hancock County Board of Health regarding the house next to the railroad tracks in Mortimer. The window of this house out and piles of trash are in the front yard area.

The installation of a traffic mirror on TR108 near the railroad crossing was discussed. Cost estimates are being researched.

Flanagan advised that a Home Depot truck damaged the guard rail on the north east corner of TR-142 and SR 613. This section of guard rail has been damaged twice since the Home Depot rapid distribution center has been opened on 8/17/2010 by trucks that missed the TR-114 entrance.

Flanagan also advised that he received an undated letter from Jim Barker of the Office of Findlay Mayor Pete Sehnert accusing the Allen Township Fire Department of utilizing a fire hydrant to fill swimming pools. Fire Chief Hickman emphatically denies this allegation and will speak with Mr. Barker.

Meeting adjourned at 8:20 p.m.
